

In honor of our 68th year, this article is re-published from the MAY 2003 issue of the *Captree LOG*. Each month we will bring to you articles or stories, or in some cases recipes, from past *Captree LOGs*.

No matter what the date Recipes are timeless. This looks delicious. Let us know if any of you try it out!

Cake:

1/4 cup shortening

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1 egg

1/2 cup strong cold coffee

1 1/2 cup flour

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

½ teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon allspice

1/2 cup raisins

lcing:

2 cups powdered sugar

1 tablespoon milk

Garnish:

½ cup chopped pecans (I always add more)

- 1. Mix together thoroughly first 3 ingredients.
- 2. Add the egg and beat well.
- 3. Add cold coffee gradually, mixing well
- 4. Sift together next 5 ingredients.
- 5. Add raisins
- 6. Stir both mixtures together and pour into a greased and floured 9 x 13 inch pan.
- 7. Bake at 350° for 18 to 20 minutes.
- 8. Mix together the powdered sugar and milk til silky.
- 9. When cool, pour or drizzle the icing over to the top.
- 10. Add the pecans.

catch shopper's attention coming into the store and passing Captree's display, they questioned if they knew about the recently enacted New York State Boating Law, also known as Brianna's Law. Surprisingly, many had no knowledge of the new law. Once explained some commented that they been boating for xx number of years and it did not apply to them. At this point Mike handed them a flyer he made that explained that everyone must take a boating course by January 2025, no matter what age they are. I have included the details of the new law below.

- Those born on or after 1/1/1993 need a safety certificate beginning January 2020.
- Those born on or after 1/1/1988 need a safety certificate beginning January 2022.
- Those born on or after 1/1/1983 need a safety certificate beginning January 2023.
- Those born on or after 1/1/1978 need a safety certificate beginning January 2024.
- All powerboat operators, regardless of age, need a boating safety certificate beginning in January 2025.

With the new law becoming effective January 1, 2020, all our members should be envoys and get this information out to the public and inform them that Captree is available to teach the required boating course. This is a great way to get more individuals into our classes and ultimateky get new members.


