





MEMBER INVOLVEMENT

Here we are into October and as I write I wonder where the summer season has gone. Well, summer was officially over, and autumn began on September 23rd. For our boaters, this past summer had been a mixed bag of weather including rain, clouds and wind, and it always seemed that the weekends had all of the above. Hopefully, we can get in a few boating days in October, before we put our boats away for the winter.

We were lucky to get two good days in September during the Labor Day weekend. Commander Lea Tracy was looking all summer for one big Raft-up and that all came about on Sunday, September 2nd. As you all know, Lea was under the weather and unable to attend our weekend boating activities during the summer, however, when she said she would be out on the water on September 2nd, it was time for all of us to rise to the occasion and honor her request for a "Big Raft-up".

So, on September 2nd, we had our biggest raft-up ever under Commander Tracy's watch with nineteen boats rafting up for most of the day. Two boats towards the middle of the raft-up had to leave earlier than the rest of the group so we used our seamanship skills to get them on their way without breaking apart the rest of the boats. If you never saw it done, it is simple, however, it must be done with help from the boats on the port and starboard sides of the boat leaving the raft-up.

When a boat moves out of a raft-up we must get the raft-up back together. The procedure is to pass a long line from the bow of the boat on the port side to the bow of the boat on the starboard side of the boat leaving the raft-up. The same must be done at the stern of the boat leaving the raftup. Now a boat can leave a raft-up by either moving forward or by backing out, however, moving forward could be difficult as you must avoid the anchor lines securing the raft-up. Regardless, we had both scenarios at our Big Raft-up on the 2nd. If the boat is backing out, and it has a flybridge and antennas, the stern line must be long enough to go up near the bow of the boat leaving, across its bow, and back to the stern of the boat staying. As the departing boat is backing down, the boats on either side pull the bow and stern lines to pull both sides of the raft-up together. Once fenders are adjusted, the bow and stern lines are secured and more than likely a spring line added. I told you it was simple.

I am sure that Lea has thanked all that made the Big Raftup possible, but I would like to thank you here for making September 2nd a wonderful day for Lea and her family members that were there. I have listed here those that were there by name and not by boat name since some of the boats have no names. Attending were Dianne & Frank Alberti, Jerry Cappa, Fran Cooper, Katie & Bob Fisher, Holly & Michael Ferruso, Ken Gavey, Pavlos Mourdoukoutas and his cousin, Linda & John LaDez, Joanie & Jimmie Malone, Meredith & Jimmy Malone, Maria & Shane McSweeney, Michael Richter, Judy & Bob Silz, Jack Stange, Ed, Jen, Kyle and Sarah Tracy, Erica, Melissa, Mac, Iris, & Harrison (Jen Tracy's sister & family), Kathy & Frank Verderber, Tom Zimmer, Brian Carey, Associate members Henry & Arlene Lynn and Gary & Marcia Jones, all from Hempstead Bay, former Captree member Nancy Oakley & Jim, Madelyn and me, and of course Lea & George Tracy with their daughter Jackie and granddaughter Emma Ward. Captree's last September activity was its Fall Rendezvous held on Saturday and Sunday the 22nd and 23rd at Cedar Beach Marina. 




